

Recommended Changes to the IITPSA Memorandum of Incorporation and the Rules of IITPSA - AGM 2021

A. IITPSA Code of Ethics and IITPSA Code of Good Practice

In May 2021, the IITPSA Board resolved that the existing IITPSA "Code of Conduct" (Ethical Codes) be replaced with a new IITPSA "Code of Ethics", based on the new IFIP exemplar (which is, in turn, based on that of the ACM).

It was also resolved that the existing, accompanying IITPSA "Code of Practice" would be renamed to the IITPSA "Code of Good Practice".

Both Codes apply to all IITPSA members and are available in the AGM Board pack.

In the table below, you will find the details of the required changes to the **IITPSA Memorandum of Incorporation** and the **Rules of IITPSA** (Resolution numbers 5.1 and 5.2 respectively) to correctly reflect the new names of the two Codes. These required changes are being presented to the 2021 Annual General Meeting of Members for approval by special resolution, with or without amendment.

B. IITPSA Rules: Classes of Membership

For many years, there has been some concern about Corporate or Company members for two reasons:

• Who represents the Company (as an IT Practitioner or Professional)? The fee structure shows the maximum number of members who may attend events (at the member rate), but this is difficult to control. Also, members must be held accountable to a prescriptive code of ethics, with sanctions for violations. This is almost impossible to do when the member is a company – who is the transgressor?



• SAQA have expressed concern over this class of membership because we are a professional body.

At the May 2021 Board meeting, the IITPSA Board reviewed IITPSA Classes of Membership, and resolved to:

- 1. Rename "Institutional Member" to "Educational Institution" (clause 5.2.3)
- 2. Remove "Corporate Member" (clause 5.2.4) and replace it with two new grades, namely:
 - a. Small Business Enterprise (renamed clause 5.2.4)
 - b. Supporting Partner (new clause 5.2.5)

In the table below, you will find the details of the required changes to the **Rules of IITPSA** (Resolution numbers 6.1 to 6.5) for the changes to **Classes of Membership**. These required changes are being presented to the 2021 Annual General Meeting of Members for approval by special resolution, with or without amendment.
